No written agreements are required for these staff positions. Information pertinent to the retention of these individuals is stated below. This amendment is necessary in order to add an intern to this Board Report and to redistribute the dollars from other interns. This will result in no additional costs. This further amendment is necessary to add two new investigators, delete two investigators and one intern, to change the hourly rate for one intern effective February 21, 2001, and to redistribute the dollars amongst the remaining investigators and interns.

TERM: The term of retention for each staff member shall commence July 1, 2000 and end June 30, 2001.

DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES: The Office of the Inspector General has hired retired and off-duty police officers to respond to allegations of employee misconduct and contract fraud. Investigators will investigate and prepare findings on allegations of employee misconduct and contract fraud and will provide an investigative report of findings. These Investigators will use their own vehicles or in investigations involving surveillance will use the pool-leased cars at the direction of the Inspector General. Other administrative support staff will maintain the Office's web-site; provide computer technical support to the entire staff; legal research, as well as other clerical duties as required. The majority of these administrative support staff attended Chicago Public Schools and are currently college students. Compensation will be based on time worked.

Conflicts – The agreement shall not be legally binding on the Board if entered into in violation of the provisions of 105 ILCS 5/34-21.3 which restricts the employment of, or the letting of contracts to, former Board members during the one year period following expiration or other termination of their terms of office.

Indebtedness – The Board's Indebtedness Policy adopted July 26, 1995 (95-0726-EX3), as amended from time to time, shall be incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Ethics – The Board's Ethics Code adopted September 27, 1995 (95-0927-RU3), as amended from time to time, shall be incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Contingent Liability – The agreement shall contain the clause that any expenditure beyond the current fiscal year is deemed a contingent liability, subject to appropriation in the subsequent fiscal year budget(s).
