Note: This is an amendment to Grant Item #1 on Board report 00-0126-ED3, approved on January 26, 2000, in order to reflect an extension in the funding period and to reflect the return/refund of \$1,315,000 to the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE). ISBE forwarded only \$1,375,000 of the total grant of \$2,750,000 before determining that the ISBE reports on the first 75 schools to receive funding were delayed, resulting in an inadequate amount of time for school program development and approval by the court monitor. Sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000) of the advance had been expended by the Chicago Public Schools prior to a freeze (initiated by ISBE) on the advanced amount. This return of funds will release ISBE federal IDEA funds that would otherwise lapse at the state level. The State Board of Education will reissue the returned funds in FY02.

Indebtedness -- The Board's Indebtedness Policy adopted July 26, 1995 (95-0726-EX3), as amended from time to time, shall be incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Ethics -- The Board's Ethics Code adopted September 27, 1995 (95-0927-RU3), as amended from time to time, shall be incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Contingent Liability -- The agreement shall contain the clause that any expenditure beyond the current fiscal year is deemed to be a contingent liability, subject to appropriation in the subsequent fiscal year budget(s).
