RATIFY THE RENEWAL OF THE GRANT DISTRIBUTION AGREEMENT WITH THE CHICAGOLAND CHAMBER OF COMMERCE

THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER REPORTS THE FOLLOWING DECISION:

Ratify to renewal of the grant distribution agreement with the Chicagoland Chamber of Commerce for the distribution of funds received under the Chicago Education-to-Careers System Grant from the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) and authorize payment as a fiscal agent of ISBE grant funds to the Chicagoland Chamber of Commerce at a cost not to exceed \$32,500. A written document to renew this agreement is currently being negotiated. No payment shall be made prior to the execution of the written agreement. The authority granted herein shall automatically rescind in the event a written document is not executed within 60 days of the date of this Board Report. ORIGINAL AGREEEMENT: The original grant distribution agreement (authorized by Board Report #00-00426-ED6) was for a term commencing August 1, 1999 and ending August 30, 2000 with the Board having one 1-year option to renew. The 1-year option to renew was exercised for a term commencing August 31,2000 and ending August 30, 2001 (Authorized by Board Report 01-0124-PR19).

RENEWAL PERIOD: By mutual agreement of the parties, the grant distribution agreement is being renewed for a period commencing September 1, 2001 and ending August 31,2002. This agreement shall have no options to renew.

GRANT DESCRITPTION: This is the fifth year of the 5-year Chicago Education-to-Careers System Grant from ISBE, which provides links among Chicago Public Schools, community colleges, post-secondary institutions and the private sector. The grant works to combine school-based learning and on-the-job instruction into a systematic structured learning sequence that allows students to obtain a variety of options including post secondary education, technical training and skilled entry- level work. The Chicagoland Chamber of Commerce will be provided funding from the grant to promote career awareness, exploration, and training within the City of Chicago.

On April 25, 2001, the Board accepted the ISBE Chicago Education-to-Careers System Grant in the amount of \$1,353,515 (Board Report 01-0425-ED6) of which \$32,500 was specified by ISBE for payment to the Chicagoland Chamber of Commerce.

COMPENSATION: The Chicagoland Chamber of Commerce shall be paid in one lump sum upon execution of the agreement, not to exceed the sum of \$32,500.

AUTHORIZATION: Authorize the General Counsel to include other relevant terms and conditions in the written renewal agreement. Authorize the President and Secretary to execute the renewal agreement.

Conflicts - The agreement shall not be legally binding on the Board if entered into in violation of the provisions of 105 ILCS 5/34-21.3 which restricts the employment of, or the letting of contracts to, former Board members during the one year period following expiration or other termination of their terms of office.

Indebtedness - The Board's Indebtedness Policy adopted July 26, 1995 (95-0726-EX3), as amended from time to time, shall be incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Ethics - The Board's Ethics Code adopted September 27, 1995 (95-0927-RU3), as amended from time to time, shall be incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Contingent Liability - The agreement shall contain the clause that any expenditure beyond the current fiscal year is deemed a contingent liability, subject to appropriation in the subsequent fiscal year budget(s).
