ESTABLISH MICHELE CLARK AS AN ACADEMIC PREPARATORY HIGH SCHOOL, ADJUST THE ATTENDANCE AREAS FOR MAY, DOUGLASS, AND EMMET, AND CHANGE GRADE STRUCTURE AT L. ARMSTRONG

THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER RECOMMENDS:

Effective July 1, 2002, establish Michele Clark school, located at 5101 West Harrison Street, as a preparatory high school serving grades six through twelve by application. This change is not applicable to students currently enrolled at Michele Clark. This change is also not applicable to students residing in the Oscar De Priest's attendance area in grades seven through eighth.

Effective July 1, 2002, change the grade structure at Louis Armstrong elementary school located at 5345 West Congress Parkway from grades three through five to grades three through six.

Effective July 1, 2002, change the attendance area for the May Community Academy to include seventh graders residing within the Louis Armstrong attendance area.

Effective July 1, 2003, change the attendance area for the May Community Academy to include eight graders residing within the Louis Armstrong attendance area.

Effective July 1, 2002, change the attendance area for the Frederick A. Douglass Academy located at 543 North Waller Avenue, to include sixth graders residing within the attendance areas of the John Hay Community Academy and the Ronald E. McNair Academic Center.

Effective July 1, 2003, change the attendance area for the Frederick A. Douglass Academy to include seventh graders residing within the John Hay Community Academy's attendance area.

Effective July 1, 2004, change the attendance area for the Frederick A. Douglass Academy to include eighth graders residing within the John Hay Community Academy's attendance

Effective July 1, 2002, remove Douglass, and Clark as optional receiving schools for seventh graders residing in the Ellington attendance area. Establish Emmet as the exclusive home school for these students.

Effective July 1, 2003, remove Douglass, and Clark as optional receiving schools for eighth graders residing in the Ellington attendance area. Establish Emmet as the exclusive home school for these students.

The existing Clark local school council voting boundaries will remain in effect through the 2004-2005 school year. A new local school council voting district will be subsequently established.

DESCRIPTION:

These changes are necessary to convert the Michele Clark middle school into a preparatory high school serving grades six through twelve, where students are selectively enrolled.

Michele Clark currently serves sixth, seventh and eight graders who reside in the attendance areas of Louis Armstrong, Oscar De Priest, John Hay and Ronald McNair schools.

Starting with the 2002-2003 school year, May will become the home school for seventh graders residing within the Louis Armstrong attendance area, while Douglass will become the home school for sixth graders residing within the Hay and McNair's attendance areas.

A change in grade structure at Louis Armstrong is needed to extend it from fifth grade to sixth grade.

Seventh and eight graders currently residing in the Ellington's attendance area have the option of enrolling at Clark, Douglass, or Emmet. Beginning with the 2002-2003 school year Emmet will become the exclusive home school for seventh graders, and in the following year, for eighth graders.

A change of grade structure at McNair from kindergarten through five to grades kindergarten through eight will take place at the completion of a new facility currently under construction.

Michele Clark will continue to be the home school for seventh and eighth graders residing in the De Priest's attendance area until a new facility, currently in design, is completed.

Grades seven through eight:

Beginning at Central Avenue and Jackson Boulevard East to Lotus Avenue
North to Adams Street
East to Laramie Avenue
South to Jackson Boulevard
West to Lockwood Avenue
South to Congress Drive
West to Lotus Avenue
South to Harrison Street
West to Central Avenue
North to the starting point.
