APPROVE EXERCISING THE SECOND OPTION TO EXTEND THE PRE-QUALIFICATION STATUS OF EDUCATIONAL AND INSTRUCTIONAL CONSULTANTS

THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER REPORTS THE FOLLOWING DECISION:

Approve exercising the second option to extend the agreements with the attached list of educational and instructional consultants to provide programs that will enhance the quality and development of curriculum to CPS students in grades K-12, at a cost for the second option period not to exceed \$5,000,000.00 in the aggregate. Written extension agreements exercising this second option are currently being negotiated. No payment shall be made to any Consultant during the second option period prior to the execution of such consultant's written extension agreement. The pre-qualification status approved herein for each consultant shall automatically rescind in the event a written document is not executed within 90 days of the date of this Board Report. Information pertinent to this option is stated below.

ORIGINAL AGREEMENTS: The original agreements for all consultants except for HRDI (authorized by Board Report 00-0223-PR4) are for a term commencing January 1, 2000 and ending June 30, 2001, with the Board having 3 options to extend for 1 year periods. The first option to renew extended the agreements for a term commencing July 1, 2001 and ending June 30, 2002 (authorized by Board Report 01-0523-PR25). The original agreement for HRDI (authorized by Board report 00-0223-PR3) is for a term commencing July 1, 2000 and ending June 30, 2001, with no options to extend. The HRDI agreement was renewed for a term commencing July 1, 2001 and ending June 30, 2002 (authorized by Board report 01-0523-PR26). The original agreements were awarded pursuant to a duly advertised Request for Proposals (Specification #99-250181).

OPTION PERIOD: The term of each agreement is being extended for 1 year commencing July 1, 2002 and ending June 30, 2003. Additionally, the renewal agreement for HRDI shall provide the Board with the option to renew the agreement for one year.

OPTION PERIODS REMAINING: There is 1 option to extend for 1 year remaining.

SERVICES/DELIVERABLES: Each consultant shall continue to provide the services and deliverables stated in their original agreements.

COMPENSATION: Consultants shall be paid during this option period as follows: The sum of payments to all pre-qualified educational and instructional consultants for the pre-qualification term shall not exceed \$5,000,000.00.

USE OF POOL: All Chicago Public Schools and User Departments are authorized to receive services from the pre-qualified pool as follows: Each School or department shall select a vendor and evidence such selection by a purchase order for services, which purchase order shall reflect the dollar amount for the services selected, and which purchase order will be sent directly from each School or Department to the selected vendor. A directory has been developed which will be distributed to each school and department, which specifies the services each consultant is pre-qualified to provide under this pool. The directory will be organized by area of expertise and will include all the information necessary to contact pre-qualified firms directly to provide the services required. M/WBE status information for each consultant will also be included in the directory.

AUTHORIZATION: Authorize the General Counsel to include other relevant terms and conditions in the written option documents. Authorize the President and Secretary to execute the option documents.

AFFIRMATIVE ACTION: Pursuant to Section 6.2 of the Revised Remedial Plan for Minority and Women Business Enterprise Contract Participation (M/WBE Plan), the Per Contract and Category Goals method for M/WBE participation will be utilized. Thus, contracts for subsequent vendors from the pool created by this contract will be subject to compliance reviews on a contract-by-contract basis. Aggregated compliance of the vendors in the pool will be reported on a quarterly basis.

LSC REVIEW: Local School Council approval will be obtained whenever a school decides to use one of the prequalified consultants.

GENERAL CONDITIONS:

Inspector General – Each party to the agreement shall acknowledge that, in accordance with 105 ILCS 5/34-13.1, the Inspector General of the Chicago Board of Education has the authority to conduct certain investigations and that the Inspector General shall have access to all information and personnel necessary to conduct those investigations.

Conflicts – The agreement shall not be legally binding on the Board if entered into in violation of the provisions of 105 ILCS 5/34-21.3 which restricts the employment of, or the letting of contracts to, former Board member during the one year period following expiration or other termination of their terms of office.

Indebtedness – The Board's Indebtedness Policy adopted July 26, 1995 (95-0726-EX3), as amended from time to time, shall be incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Ethics – The Board's Ethics Code adopted September 27, 1995 (95-0927-RU3), as amended from time to time, shall be incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.
