## RESOLUTION RE: THE GROW OUR OWN IPLP TEACHER SCHOLARSHIP AWARD WINNERS SPONSORED BY THE GROW OUR OWN PROGRAM OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES OF THE CHICAGO PUBLIC SCHOOLS

WHEREAS, the scholarship winners for the Grow Our Own Program are Ardia Adah-Bush of Hyde Park Career Academy, who will be attending Millikin University, Theresa Blackman of Morgan Park Academy who will be attending University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, Cynthia Leung of Whitney Young Magnet High School, who will be attending Loyola University Chicago, Maricruz Rodriguez of Juarez Community Academy, who will be attending Loyola University Chicago, Aubrey Rogers of Hancock High School, who will be attending Loyola University Chicago, and Zahra Somani of Sullivan High School, who will be attending DePaul University; and

WHEREAS, the Grow Our Own Program is managed by Tasha Green of Human Resources with an Advisory Council consisting of representatives from the Chief Executive Office, the Chief Education Office, the Office of High School Development, the CPS Teachers Academy, the Office of Education to Careers, the Regional Educational Officers, and our outside partners consisting of the Golden Apple Foundation, and Future Teachers of Chicago/Illinois;
