## AMEND BOARD REPORT 00-1115-RS7 AMEND BOARD REPORT 96-1120-RS7 RESOLUTION RE: HONORARY STUDENT MEMBER OF THE CHICAGO BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO

**WHEREAS**, the Chicago Board of Education of the City of Chicago recognizes its responsibility to ensure the a quality of education for the youth of the community; and

WHEREAS, the student population <u>possesses</u> is a reservoir of unique insight and valuable information <u>concerning</u> at the <u>process of education at its most</u> fundamental <u>level</u> oducation process, the classroom; and

WHEREAS, the Board is determined to improve communication opportunities between students and board members and administrators; and

**WHEREAS**, a better informed and more involved student population is a significant contribution to the improvement of education in the community;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Chicage Board of Education of the City of Chicago seat shall appoint a duly elected representative of the high school elected student leadership as an Honorary Student Member of the Board of Education in accordance with the following parameters:

- The <u>office</u> Honorary Student Board Member shall be a <u>an honorary</u>, non-voting <u>office</u> Honorary Member of the Board of Education.
- In order t-To be eligible to serve as an Honorary Student Board Member a student shall be in either any of grades 9 through 12 9th, 10th, 11th or 12th grade and shall have been elected by his/her the student body of his/her school to serve as LSC student representative or student council president, vice-president, treasurer or secretary.

In order t-To be eligible to serve as an Honorary Student Board Member, a student will shall have a minimum overall grade point average of 2.0 2.5, an attendance rate of at least 90%, and no history of incidents of misconduct or violations of the Uniform Discipline Code.

- The election of the student representative shall be conducted by the students Eligible students shall select three candidates for the office of Honorary Student Board Member pursuant to a non-binding advisory poll under the direction of the Chief Executive Officer or his designee. The selection shall take place in May before the graduation or expiration of the term of office termination of the current Honorary Student Board Member. The Board of Education shall have final authority concerning the selection of the Honorary Student Board Member from among the three candidates selected pursuant to the student advisory poll.
- All persons students meeting the above <u>criteria</u> shall be eligible to vote <u>in the student advisory poll</u>. Any <u>such student person</u> eligible to vote shall be eligible to serve as Honorary Student Board Member of the Board of Education. The Honorary Student Board Member shall be seated annually at <u>by</u> the <u>June September</u> Board Meeting.
- The Honorary Student Board Member will be invited to attend the public business portion of all Board Meetings.
- A written release, signed by the parent or guardian, will be required before a minor the Honorary Student Board Member is seated.
- The Board Secretary shall provide a A schedule of Board meetings will be provided to the student selected to serve as Honorary Student Board Member, the student's parent(s) or guardian(s) and the school principal of his/her school by the Board Secretary.
- The term of <u>office of</u> the Honorary Student Board Member shall <u>terminate expire</u> upon: the seating of a successor, the <u>termination expiration</u> of the <u>representative's student's</u> term as a student leader at his/her school, or his/her graduation, whichever is sooner first occurs.

All <u>vacancies</u> in the <u>office of</u> Honorary Student Board Member <u>vacancies</u> shall be <u>for the</u> <u>unexpired portion of the member's term</u> filled pursuant to <u>an election a non-binding advisory poll</u> of eligible high school students, as specified above for the unexpired term.

The Honorary Student Board Member shall:

- Serve in an advisory capacity to the Board of Education on issues of concern to students.
- Attend regularly scheduled monthly meetings of the Chicago Youth Council, and join the Committee on Education.
- Produce minutes of each monthly council and committee meeting and file a copy of each set of minutes with the Board through the Board Secretary.
- Provide two reports to the Board outlining current student issues.
- Serve as liaison between the Chicago Public School student representatives and the Board of Education.
- Provide the Chief Executive Officer, or his designee, copies of all correspondence disseminated on behalf of the Chicago Youth Council and the Committee on Education.
