WHEREAS, the Northside Learning Center Huskies I Special Olympics Basketball Team represented Special Olympics Chicago in the Special Olympics Illinois Statewide Basketball Tournament on March 14-16, 2003; and

WHEREAS, the Walter Payton High School Special Olympics athletes Justin Davis and Adam Hines, under the direction of coach Jean J. Gregoire, Jr., finished the 2002-2003 Powerlifting season by winning gold medals for first place in the Special Olympics Chicago Powerlifting Tournament held February 15, 2003; and

WHEREAS, the courage, skill and good sportsmanship exhibited by each team member earned the admiration of all and reflected positively on Northside Learning Center and Payton College Prep, the school communities, and the city at large.
