EDUCATIONAL VALUE/OUTCOMES: The program, an international travel and study, is committed to ensuring cultural understanding through the Global Initiatives, a variety of educational experiences. The purpose is to expose students to cultural differences from their own, to expand awareness of the concept of the global community, to increase world understanding through indigenous experiences, to enhance language skills, to promote world peace through tolerance of differences, and to facilitate curricular concepts and crosscultural connections. To this end, Northside College Preparatory study abroad program have been designed, thus the trip to China is proposed and planned.

Contingent Liability – Any agreement shall contain the clause that any expenditure beyond the current fiscal year is deemed a contingent liability, subject to appropriation in the subsequent fiscal year budget(s).
