AUTHORIZE CONTINUED RETENTION OF THE LAW FIRM FOLEY & LARDNER

THE GENERAL COUNSEL REPORTS THE FOLLOWING DECISION:

Continued retention of the law firm Foley & Lardner.

DESCRIPTION: The General Counsel continues the retention of the law firm Foley & Lardner to represent the Board in litigation filed by the Chicago Teachers Pension Fund concerning alleged deficiencies in payments made to the Fund by the Board for the benefit of certain categories of employees. Active settlement negotiations are underway in this litigation. In addition, the firm is utilized on an ongoing, as-needed basis to provide legal consultation and opinions regarding pension and tax issues that arise in connection with the Board's financial transactions. Additional authorization for the firm's services are requested in the amount of \$25,000. As invoices are received, they will be reviewed by the General Counsel and, if satisfactory, processed for payment.

GENERAL CONDITIONS:

Conflicts - The agreement shall not be legally binding on the Board if entered into in violation of the provisions of 105 ILCS 5/34-21.3 which restricts the employment of, or the letting of contracts to, former Board Members during the one year period following expiration or other termination of their terms of office.

Indebtedness - The Board's Indebtedness Policy adopted July 26, 1995, (95-0726-EX3), as amended from time to time, is hereby incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Ethics - The Board's Ethics Code adopted September 27, 1995, (95-0927-RU3), as amended from time to time, is hereby incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Contingent Liability - The agreement shall contain the clause that any expenditure beyond the current fiscal year is deemed a contingent liability, subject to appropriation in the subsequent fiscal year budget(s).
