Item 1: Professional Learning Service Providers	What percentage of vendors are supporting Skyline?	13 of the 60 (21.6%) vendors in the Professional Learning Services Pool are providing support related to Skyline. This includes teacher and school-leaders facing professional learning support, such as coaching and workshops, for schools seeking targeted Skyline implementation support beyond what is provided through universal District-led offerings. It also includes services related to the support of central office teams in the development and continuous improvement of the District's Skyline materials and professional learning supports. Item 1: Professional Learning Service Providers	What kind of professional learning does Lego Brand Retail provide?	District spending is with LEGO Education, who operates under the same legal entity and Federal TIN as LEGO Brand Retail. LEGO Education has a long-standing relationship with the CPS Computer Science Department and provides support related to school-based CPS robotics programs. Much of the spending through LEGO that supports our school-based robotics programs has been generously provided by grants from the LEGO foundation.	Office of Teaching and Learning
Item 11: Green Schools Solar Program Vendor	How has LEED certification been considered in this process?	All new facilities built by the District are LEED certified. Although there is a LEED certification for existing school buildings, the time and costs involved for the District to pursue this designation present challenges given the age of the portfolio of buildings and the significant deferred need for critical systems.
