


Culture & climate has improved dramatically

Since SY2010,

- 60% decrease in serious misconducts per 100 students
- 67% decrease in out of school suspensions
- 83% decrease in arrests



As restorative justice practices increased, serious misconducts decreased*



Important to note there is not a 1:1 correlation; many factors influenced this decrease; RJ was a part but not the whole.








Some Indicators of Forward Progress

While there is a lag in postsecondary metrics such as 5-year graduation rates and college enrollment results, leading indicators are promising.






